Is the Highlands Ranch Soccer Association Office Open?

- The HRSA staff is working from home during this time. The best way to communicate with us is via email.

When Will the Spring Season Start?

- The season is currently suspended until May 1st. Colorado Soccer Association has targeted a tentative date of May 9th to 'return to play.' The proposed dates are May 9, 16, 23, 30 June 6, 13, 20, 21. We are assessing the proposed CSA time-line as it relates to our field availability and other factors. This process is strictly related to planning should we be able to 'return to play.' We will continue to provide additional updates as we have more information. **We will not return to the fields until we have been approved by the proper state and national authorities.** This applies to Recreational, Academy and Competitive teams.

Why not cancel the season now?

- Colorado Soccer Association (CSA), our governing agency, recommends it is too soon to give up on a season. The physical, mental, and social well-being provided by soccer got many of us through hard times and made us better individuals. HRSA and CSA believe that continuing to provide these benefits and fulfilling these needs has to be our goal. We are staying hopeful about the opportunity to still play a spring league season.

Why Has HRSA Not Made a Decision on Refunds or Credits?

- Club leadership is considering all scenarios surrounding donations, credits, refunds, and hardships. If you have a suggestion or an idea for us to consider, given our 501(c)(3) non-profit status, please reach out to us. We hope to have a solution to share with our families as soon as the spring season is finalized, however we are still planning to play. - No, we are following the directives of our Governor and Colorado Soccer Association, along with the recommendations of Tri County Health and the CDC. There are not to be small groups, large groups, team trainings or games during this period of time we are asked to stay in our homes.

Can We Still Sign Up for Camps?
